U.S. Congress unlikely to pass resolutions against Iran by March: ex-negotiator

TEHRAN – Former Iranian nuclear negotiator Hossein Mousavian says it is unlikely that the U.S. Congress would pass new resolutions against the Islamic republic by March 2015.

In an interview with IRNA published on Thursday, Mousavian

said as the two sides are scheduled to reach an agreement over the principles of a final deal by March, it seems unlikely that the Congress would seek to adopt new resolutions against Tehran by that time.

He predicted that if the Congress decides to go for such a resolution, U.S. President Barack Obama would veto it.

Elsewhere in his remarks, Mousavian underlined that he is optimistic about the prospect of the negotiations, because even if the Congress attempts to impede the talks, the U.S. administration will not be able to form a global consensus against Iran.
